MEMORANDUM CIRCULAR

NO 2007-42

TO : ALL PROVINCIAL GOVERNORS, CITY/MUNICIPAL MAYORS, PUNONG BARANGAYS, DILG REGIONAL/PROVINCIAL/CITY DIRECTORS AND MUNICIPAL LOCAL GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS OFFICERS AND OTHERS CONCERNED IN REGIONS X, XI & XII

SUBJECT : DAYS OF PEACE: KAYANG-KAYA KUNG SAMA-SAMA, BATA MUNA CAMPAIGN

The 1987 Philippine Constitution, Republic Act 7610 or the Special Protection of Children against Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act, the Convention on the Rights of the Child and other related policies, human rights conventions and treaties, provide measures to protect and assist children affected by armed conflict, taking into consideration the best interest and welfare of the child.

Further, Executive Order No. 03, series of 2001, identifies the "pursuit of social, economic and political reforms to address the root causes of internal armed conflicts and social unrest" as one of the main paths to peace and Agenda No. 9 of President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo's 10-Point Agenda affirms the termination of hostilities through a just conclusion of the peace process.

In view of this, the Office of the Presidential Adviser on the Peace Process (OPAPP), in partnership with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) will launch the campaign "**Days of Peace: Kayang-kaya kung sama-sama, Bata muna**" on **April 16, 2007**. The project aims to foster peace through the provision of essential services for children and women in conflict-affected and peace agreement communities in **Mindanao**.

The first stage of the campaign will piggyback with the "Garantisadong Pambata (GP) which will be launched Nationwide by the Department of Health on April 16, 2007. The second stage will involve the provision of basic educational materials and possible inclusion of birth registration which will be done in June, 2007.

In support to this undertaking, all concerned local government units are hereby encouraged to join the campaign by mobilizing their local health and social workers, local school boards, parents-teachers community associations (PTCAs), to intensify the delivery of services such as immunization, micronutrient supplementation, de-worming and breastfeeding in the following areas in Mindanao:

- Areas covered by the GRP-MILF Agreement on the Cessation of Hostilities
- Peace and Development Communities (PDCs) in the ACT for Peace Programme
- Peace Agreement areas of Rebolusyonaryong Partidong Manggagawa-Mindanao
