SUBJECT

CONCERTED ACTIONS TO ADDRESS THE IMPACTS

TYPHOONS ONDOY AND PEPENG

Pursuant to Section 1 of Republic Act No. 8185, five percent (5%) of the estimated revenue from regular sources of a local government unit shall be set aside as annual lump sum appropriations for relief, rehabilitation, reconstruction and other works or services in connection with calamities which may occur during the budget year.

On the other hand, Section 5 (a) of the Rules and Regulations Implementing Republic Act No. 8185 states that local government units may also allocate or use a portion of the 5% calamity fund to other affected areas on condition that the said areas are declared as under state of calamity by the sanggunian concerned. In Section 5(b), it is so provided that: (a) the calamity fund shall be utilized for the relief, reconstruction, rehabilitation, and other works or services in connection with the calamities which may occur during the budget year; and (b) a portion of the calamity fund may also be authorized to be used by the local government unit concerned to provide financial assistance to other local government units whose area or portion thereof had been declared under the state of calamity by its sanggunian. (underscoring supplied)

In the thinking of the Rules: (a) relief operations refer to activities undertaken to provide emergency assistance to victims of calamity usually through the provision of temporary shelter, relief goods or commodities; (b) rehabilitation means the restoration to the former living conditions of the community affected by the calamity; (c) reconstruction includes rebuilding, repair or replacement of public facilities, buildings and other infrastructure, or parts thereof, destroyed or damaged during the occurrence of calamity; and (d) other works and services undertaken in the course of rehabilitation or reconstruction such as but not limited to medical services, repair of equipment, financial assistance to calamity victims, and those essential to disaster control and management.

Under Section 321 of the Local Government Code, a supplemental budget may also be enacted in times of public calamity by way of budgetary realignment to set aside appropriations for the purchase of supplies and materials or the payment of services which are exceptionally urgent or absolutely indispensable to prevent imminent danger to, or loss of, life or property, in the jurisdiction of the local government unit or in other areas declared in a state of calamity by the President. (emphasis ours)

In support of continuing efforts to address the impacts of the devastation brought about by Typhoons Ondoy and Pepeng, all Local Chief Executives of unaffected local government units are strongly encouraged to extend financial assistance to concerned local government units in the calamity areas, to wit:

- 1. National Capital Region
- 2. Cordillera Autonomous Region Mountain Province, Ifugao, Benguet, Kalinga, Apayao and Abra
- 3. Region I Pangasinan, La Union, Ilocos Sur and Ilocos Norte
- 4. Region II Isabela, Quirino, Nueva Vizcaya, Cagayan and Batanes
- 5. Region III Aurora, Nueva Ecija, Zambales, Pampanga, Bulacan, Tarlac and Bataan
- 6. Region IV-A Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Rizal and Quezon
- 7. Region IV-B Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro and Marinduque
- 8. Region V Catanduanes, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Albay and Sorsogon.

Donor-local government units may direct their financial support to donee-local government unit/s chosen or, may opt to course through the Department in the distribution of such financial aid.

All DILG Regional Directors are directed to immediately disseminate this Memorandum Circular to all local governments within their regional assignments and to extend technical and appropriate assistance to unaffected local government units to effect such financial assistance to affected local government units.

Further, all DILG Regional Directors are directed to submit:

- daily report not later than 2:00 p.m. starting on October 5, 2009 and
- real-time information (RTI)

on the actions undertaken by that level and by the supporting local governments to the Bureau of Local Government Supervision, being the designated DILG Central Information Coordinating Center.
