SUBJECT

: OBSERVANCE OF THE 27TH INTERNATIONAL COASTAL CLEANUP DAY

The annual International Coastal Cleanup (ICC) Day, where the Philippines is an active participant, will be held on October 06, 2012. During cleanups, marine debris information are recorded by volunteers by the use of standard data cards (attached). All data gathered from these cards help in developing better solutions to garbage problems in water systems through the formulation of policies, which can be beneficial to LGUs.

Relative to the above, all Provincial Governors, City and Municipal Mayors and Punong Barangays are hereby encouraged to participate in the cleanup by:

- Conducting cleanup activities on coastal areas and/or inland water systems (rivers, esteros, lakes and the like) in their respective localities and ensure the active participation of their constituents;
- Accomplishing the ICC data cards provided and submitting it to ICC Philippines; and
- 3. Providing materials and equipment necessary for proper waste collection and disposal.

Also, all Regional Management Coordinating Council members are tasked to cause the participation of their field personnel in the said cleanup.
