: 18-DAY CAMPAIGN TO END VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN (VAW)

Since year 2002, the Philippines has been joining the annual campaign which aims to increase awareness on violence against women (VAW) and take action to eliminate it. This annual campaign is pursuant to RA 10398 – "Declaring November 25 of every year as the National Consciousness Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women and Children" and Proclamation 1172 s. 2006 – "Declaring November 25 to December 12 of Every Year as the 18-Day Campaign to End Violence Against Women.

This year, the Philippine Commission on Women in coordination with other government and non-government organizations is leading the nationwide commemoration of the 18-Day Campaign to End Violence Against Women (VAW) this coming November 25 to December 12 with the theme – "End VAW Now, It's Our Duty... Gains and Ways Forward" giving emphasis on the following:

- Achievements of government and other stakeholders in terms of programs and projects addressing violence against women and children
- Male responsibility in ending violence against women and children
- Vision of VAW-free society
- Commitment and actionable steps of government and other stakeholders towards a VAW-free society

In order to ensure the success of the observance, all local government units are hereby encouraged to commemorate the 18-Day Campaign to End VAW in their respective localities and initiate activities for synchronized efforts in line with reinforcing the theme "End VAW Now, It's Our Duty...Gains and Ways Forward".

The following information shall be included for guidance of all LGUs:

Suggested Activities:

- Participation in the **ORANGE YOUR ICON FOR 18 DAYS** advocacy (briefer attached)
- Hanging a streamer in front of the municipality/city/provincial hall announcing the LGUs participation in the campaign (see PCW website for specifications/design of the streamer);
- Participation in the online campaign thread about the observance by uploading the official logo and campaign information in LGUs website, Facebook and Twitter pages (official hashtag #end VAWph);
- Inclusion of 18-Day Campaign and other VAW IEC materials in LGUs' publications or newsletters;
- Conduct of advocacy campaigns and production/dissemination of information materials about VAW to constituents, employees, clients and other stakeholders;
- LGUs with Men Opposed to VAW Everywhere (MOVE) chapters are requested to allow MOVE members among their employees to organize or join activities focused on male responsibility in ending VAW;

- Co-organizing or joining regional and local advocacy events with members of the regional and local Inter-Agency Council Against Trafficking and Violence Against Women and Children (RCATVAWC/ LCATVAWC);
- For LGUs in Greater Manila Area, participation in the following activities led by PCW:
 - November 25 Kick-off activity- Assembly of Anti-VAW Advocacy Supporters (guidelines for agency participation to be issued by PCW);
 - December 1- Promoting Safe Communities: A Forum with Male Advocates Against Violence Everywhere, AFP Theatre, Camp Aguinaldo, Quezon City (open to all MALE officials and employees)
 - December 2 Barangay VAW Desk Persons Congress (guidelines for participation of Barangays to be issued by DILG and PCW)
 - o **December 8-10** Cine Juana 2015 Film Festival (open to the public, free admission, PCW to issue announcement on films and screening schedules)

Submission of LGUs calendar of activities and reports

- In order to map-out various campaign activities throughout the country, LGUs are requested to provide PCW with information on 18-Day Campaign to End VAW activities. To facilitate this process, LGUs are advised to feature or upload announcements, reports, photos and videos of their campaign activities in their respective official agency websites, and then send a link to the site to PCW through media@pcw.gov.ph.
- LGUs that wish to have their major activities included in the national 18-Day Campaign to End VAW Calendar to be featured in PCW website are requested to submit to PCW the information about their activities using the attached form.

Use of Gender and Development (GAD) Budget

• Expenses related to the 18-Day Campaign to End VAW may be charged to the GAD Budget of government agencies, as reflected in their GAD Plans for 2015.

As a bright and optimistic color, orange represents hope and a future free from violence against women and girls.

HOW CANYOU PARTICIPATE?

- 1. Find major landmarks or icons in your area or community. Your icon can be historical places, statues, monuments or buildings.
- 2. Talk to heads of your agency, local government, corporate heads or building administrators to get support and ensure that they are willing to join this global activity for a cause.

3. Put orange decorations on your chosen icon. You can use flags, streamers or banners. You can even paint your landmark into orange if possible or use orange spotlights during the night! Be creative!

- 4. Put orange lights around your landmark/icon and light them up in the evening. Last year, major landmarks around the world were lit orange to draw attention to the issue including the Empire State Building, UN Headquarters and large screens in Times Square, the Angel of Independence in Mexico City, the Palace of the President of the Republic of Ecuador, the Torre Futura in San Salvador, the Administration Building of the Panama Canal, and the Sphinx and the Pyramids at Giza in Egypt.

Upload photos, videos and reports featuring your oranged icons and other 18-Day Campaign to End VAW activities to your official websites for everyone to know that you are part of this global campaign.
