ENJOINING PARTICIPATION TO THE "MAMAMAYAN-

MAMAYANI" GALING POOK GOVERNANCE FAIR AT THE SMX CONVENTION CENTER, MALL OF ASIA, PASAY CITY ON

AUGUST 30 - SEPTEMBER 1, 2015

The Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) recognizes the important role that civil society, people's organizations and non-government organizations play in addressing the challenges faced by our local governments which is why it has actively pursued interventions that enhance citizenship engagement in local governance processes.

In consonance with this, the DILG through the Local Government Academy (LGA) and in partnership with the Galing Pook Foundation, Local Governance Support Programme (LGSP) and World Bank, will hold a Governance Fair entitled "*Mamamayan Mamamayani*" on August 30 – September 1, 2015 at the SMX Convention Center, Mall of Asia, Pasay City.

The Governance Fair aims to strengthen the capacity of local government units in providing opportunities for inclusive people's participation in local governance as well as recognize the invaluable contribution of civil society in achieving the sustainable development goals. The three-day event will start with a Unity Walk of LGUs, NGAs and civil society groups within the Mall of Asia compound to show support to the good local governance advocacy. This will be followed by the formal opening program for Governance Fair, opening and commencement of the simultaneous forums on various local governance topics and initiatives. Exhibition booths will also be opened featuring the products and services of the LGUs and various government and private organizations. The event will be capped by the awarding of the 2015 Galing Pook winners and the first batch of citizenship awardees in a Gabi ng Parangal.

In this regard, all local officials and functionaries are strongly enjoined to participate in the Governance Fair activities. The expenses for participation to the event (transportation, accommodation and exhibit expenses) are hereby authorized chargeable against local funds, subject to applicable auditing laws, rules and regulations. All DILG Regional Directors are likewise enjoined to give this Memorandum Circular the widest dissemination to all concerned.

1. Rationale

In the Philippines today, citizenry at large recognizes good governance as the single most important factor for sustainable development. Thus, recent debates stem from every Filipino's quest for answers on: How do we achieve good governance? Governance is not limited to what the state can do for its people. It is also a **challenge of what the citizens can do for its country/community**. This modern day principle of inclusive sharing of responsibilities between the government and its people likewise constitutes sharing of accountability whether on the progression or regression of the nation.

Anchored on this premise, Galing Pook together with the civil society organizations, the private sector, local and national governments have banded together to **promote citizenship and citizen participation through a governance fair.**

2. Objectives

Dubbed as Mamamayan, Mamamayani!, the fair aims to -

- Recognize invaluable engagement of the civil society which aided various LGUs to achieve social, economic, technological, political and institutional sustainable development;
- **Strengthen** the capacity of local government units in providing for opportunities for inclusive people's participation in local governance; and
- **Inspire** the larger population of citizenry to enjoin themselves in the crusade for good governance.
