# Rehabinasyon THE FIRST NATIONAL ANTI-DRUGS SUMMIT

#### SUMMIT BRIEFER AND PROGRAM FLOW

#### Introduction:

The Summit will serve as a business review of the Duterte Administration's campaign against illegal drugs 31 months since the President's assumption to office. This is the opportunity to:

- 1. Explain the gravity of the illegal drug problem in the country; hence, the need to mount an all-encompassing campaign to end this perennial scourge.
- 2. Enumerate the gains of Rehabinasyon, through #RealNumbers #RealSolutions, and #RealStories.
- 3. Enumerate the succeeding plans for the remainder of President Duterte's term, and beyond.

#### **Target Audience:**

Around 300 people are expected to attend the Summit, which are comprised of:

- 1. Officials of ICAD member-agencies and national agencies
- 2. Local Government officials
- 3. Members of the diplomatic corps
- 4. Members of civil society organizations
- 5. Members of faith-based organizations
- 6. Members of youth organizations
- 7. Students and members of the academe
- 8. Members of national and local media

#### Overarching Message:

The tone of the Summit should reflect the message that this campaign against illegal drugs is an investment for the future, and that it is necessary to use the whole-of-government and whole-of-nation approach to achieve a drug-free nation by 2022. Hence, we enjoin all stakeholders to help rehabilitate the nation together.

#### Pain-points to be solved:

Under the overarching message, we aim to solve the following issues:

- That the government does not have a clear-cut strategy in solving the illegal drug problem;
- That the illegal drug problem is just a made-up problem to justify the alleged killings;
- That there are no follow-throughs with internal cleansing and case build-up of erring officials of enforcement agencies
- That the government is just focused on anti-drug enforcement operations and that there are no rehabilitation programs available
