For many years the Department and the local government units continuously work hand in hand towards the attainment of Excellence in Local Governance, thereby reaping the gains.



The infographic on the left shows the status of the 2011 to 2017 PCF project implementation of Region XII.

9 subprojects with a total allocation of P11, 000,000.00 and 52 subprojects amounting to P79, 000,000 were implemented for FY 2011 and 2012 respectively.

For the year 2013, 16 subprojects amounting to P24, 000,000.00 were implemented by the beneficiary LGUs.

In 2014, there are 32 subprojects amounting to P43, 000,000.00, 31 of which were completed and 1 subproject is still on the pipeline stage.

10 subprojects in 2015 with an allocation of P28, 000,000.00 were already completed while there are 14 subprojects amounting to P43, 800,000.00 for the year 2016. 6 of which are completed, 7 on-going and 1 on the pipeline stage.

Currently, 14 subprojects amounting to P31,200,000.00 are set to be implemented by the beneficiary LGUs.

2011-2017 PCF Status of Projects per Province



Commercial Booths in Sto.Niño, South Cotabato





Sto.Niño is a 3rd class municipality in the province of South Cotabato. It has a population of 40,947 (2015 census). The Municipality is an awardee of Seal of Good Local Governance in 2015 and was granted Three million (3,000,000.00) pesos. The Municipality utilized the incentive in the Construction of 10 stalls at Public Market.

The beneficiaries of this project recalled how they earned their living on the streets as food vendors as they sell under the heat of the sun or getting drenched by the rain. Since they knew nothing better to do to provide for their families, they had to take risks wandering the streets to find their customers.



Meet Josephine Togonon. She is a 49 year-old widow who used to be a street vendor with three children to support. As a beneficiary of the PCF Project, she now sells 15-peso budget meals at her fast food stall as early as 6 o'clock in the morning.

She identifies sanitation and safety as the main benefits of the project both for the vendors and costumers as well. As a food vendor, she now enjoys having an appropriate and sanitary place to organize and display her food items. Eventually, it increased her daily income.

"Para sa amon useful gid, nakabulig gid sa amon nga mga may small business. Kay kung sa amon, di kami kasarang magpatindog sang amo sini nga stall." "Thank you gid kaayo nga isa ako sa naka-avail sang proyekto. Blessed gid ako kaayo kay although nga ang amon baligya pangmasa sya, damo gid ang nakabenefit, mga students, drivers, pati ang mga kapwa namon nga negosyante."

"The project is indeed beneficial to small business owners because we could not afford to put up this kind of stall."

"I am thankful that I am one of the beneficiaries of this project. I feel blessed because students, drivers and my fellow vendors enjoy the benefits."



Concreting of a Barangay Road in Cotabato Province









Cotabato covers a total area of 9, 008.9 square kilometers occupying the northeastern tip of Region XII and centrally located in Mindanao. It is bounded on the north by the provinces of Lanao del Sur and Bukidnon, on the east by Davao City and Davao del Norte, on the west by Maguindanao and on the southeast by Sultan Kudarat and Davao del Sur. In 2014, the province received PCF amounting to Seven Million pesos (7,000,000.00) for being a Seal of Good Financial Housekeeping passer. The Province utilized the incentive in the Concreting of Brgy. Roads in Brgy. Lower Katinggawan, Bagumba and Nes in Midsayap and Brgy. Cabpangi in Libungan.

farmers For the of Bagumba, Midsayap, transporting their produce from their farm to the market was tedious and time-consuming task. had to hire a "dagit-dagit" or a "habal-habal" just to traverse a rough road to and from their farm. That is, if they get lucky. On most days, especially when rain makes the road muddy and sticky, the drivers refuse to take them so they are forced to pay the laborers extra amount to carry the produce on their back



from the farm to the market. If however the drivers agree to take them, they would have to pay extra.

Other residents like the office workers and students had to bring extra slippers to wear on the muddy road and water to wash the mud off their feet after their difficult journey to reach the town center. It is only then can they change their uniform and shoes.

Meet Fely Dominice, a senior citizen, a retired private school teacher and a mother of five children who already have families of their own. Farming is their family's main source of livelihood. They have been residents of Bagumba for ten (10) years.

According to her, all these difficulties vanished away after the project has been completed. To her, the best benefit (among many others connected to their livelihood in farming) out of the paved road is to have been given the chance to take early morning walks as an exercise and the cheaper fare from and to the town.

"We just want to say thank you very much for having this kind of project kay ini sya beneficial gid kaayo sa amon na mga farmers. Accessible na ang kalsada going in and out, kag bringing in and out ka mga products namon tungod sang kalsada."

"We just want to say thank you very much for this kind of project because it is truly beneficial to us farmers. The road is now accessible and it is easier for us to transport our produce."

Public Utility Vehicle (PUV) Terminal in Columbio





Columbio is a 1st Class Municipality in the province of Sultan Kudarat. According to the 2015 census, it has a population of 33, 258. The Municipality is a Seal of Good Local Governance awardee and received a PCF incentive of Three Million pesos (3,000,000.00). The incentive was utilized in the Construction of 16.5m x 21m dimension PUV Terminal.



Meet Flor Limba, a 61 year-old market vendor and the President of Columbio Maket Vendors Association (COMAVA). According to her, the biggest impact of the project is that while problems on the public transport were addressed, it also paved the way for the organization of street and market vendors. The local government enacted an ordinance organizing the market vendors, thus the benefits transcended beyond what was originally expected.

"Nakakabigay benepisyo sa mga negosyante dahil nakakapaghanap buhay na sila at dahil may ordinance na, ang mga sidewalk vendors po ay naorganize na pati ang market." "Maganda talaga ang proyekto. Malaki ang naitulong sa amin na mga market vendors pati na din po sa pasahero o publiko lalo na iyong mga umuuwi sa malalayo na baryo kasi umulan man o maaraw meron na po silang nasisilungan."

"It benefits the business owners because it allows them to earn a living and because there is an ordinance, the vendors are already part of an organization." "The project is good and has huge benefits not only to the vendors but also to the public most especially those who have to live in the far barrios because whatever the weather, the terminal gives them convenience."

Public Utility Vehicles (PUVs) in Columbio used to proliferate and had no terminal to fetch and unload their passengers. The commuters also had a hard time finding them because the PUVs either park in disarray near a bridge or in a waiting shed. Commuting was a struggle to most because they either had to hurry so they could catch a ride or work their way toward a crowd of other commuters who are also eager to catch a ride. All these, they do under the heat of the sun or while getting drenched in the rain.

Since the construction of the PUV terminal, all these were merely part of history. There was a complete change from struggle to comfort on the part of the PUV drivers, barkers and commuters. The construction of the terminal also allowed other businesses to flourish as shops and market stalls were also put up near the terminal.



"Maraming maraming salamat po sa DILG dahil nabigyan po kami ng pagkakataon na magkaroon ng terminal."

"Many thanks to the DILG because it has given us the chance to have a terminal."

Meet Saguira Enlolilang, year-old Community 42 Peace Officer for a Non-Government Organization (NGO). According to her, security, comfort and convenience brought the terminal are what she appreciates the most as a commuter. PUVs take turn in accommodating passengers while passengers fall in line She to be accommodated. said that since everything has been put to order, there is no need to hurry to catch a ride.



Concreting of Barangay Roads in Alabel, Sarangani



Alabel is a 1st class municipality and the capital town of the province of Sarangani. It has a population of 80,259 (2015 census). The Municipality is an awardee of the Seal of Good Financial Housekeeping and was granted 1 million (1,000,000.00) pesos. The Municipality utilized the money for the Concreting of 80.0 linear meters of Portland Concrete Pavement Cement (PCCP) in Orchid Street, Brgy. Poblacion



The Orchid Street is a primary municipal road of Poblacion, Alabel that plays a vital role in elevating the economic activity of the barangay.

The road connects Barangay Poblacion to two upland barangays, Barangays Alegria and Datal Anggas. The primary source of income of these areas is farming.

Meet Ricardo Panares, Sr. the School Administrator of the Sarangani Adventist Academy. He recalled, "the concreting of road does not only lessen the difficulty of farmers in transporting their goods and products to the town center but added attraction to our school."

One notable positive impact is the increased in the number of school enrollees. One parent testified "I enrolled my child here not that it is the nearest school from our home, but foremost because my heart is now at ease that the way towards her school is safe", she said in Bisaya.



"Sang una kini nga area rough road man ni. Karon na nasimento na, nalipay jud me nga nakahatag siya attraction sa eskwelahan. Ang mga bata dili na maabogan kung may mga sakyanan na mag-agi.

"We are very happy because this road is already concrete. It adds beauty to the school and the pupils no longer suffer from dusts of passing vehicles."



Kidapawan City, Cotabato Province




Kidapawan City is a 3rd class city and the capital of the province of Cotabato. It has a population of 140, 195 according to the 2015 census

Installation of City Plaza Lights

Kidapawan City is one of the booming cities in the SOCCSKSARGEN in terms of economic and tourism development. Thus safety and beautification of the area are key factors for a conducive place to establish a vibrant economic activity.

The Installation of Lights in the City Plaza has drawn people in the park both during the day and night.

Beneficiaries testified that the number of gangs in the area significantly decreased due to the installation of lights. Since the people feel safe and secured now, more visitors and families spend their time in the plaza resulting to a more lively economic activity.



The project is very helpful especially to students like me who uses bicycle as a means of transportation. Before, I often stumble along the way. But now I can drive safely even nighttime due to the visibility provided by the plaza lights, said Velasco in Filipino.



I am very pleased because the project added beauty to the plaza. Many visitors and families spend time with their loved ones here. With that, my income in selling peanuts increased, recalls James in Filipino.
